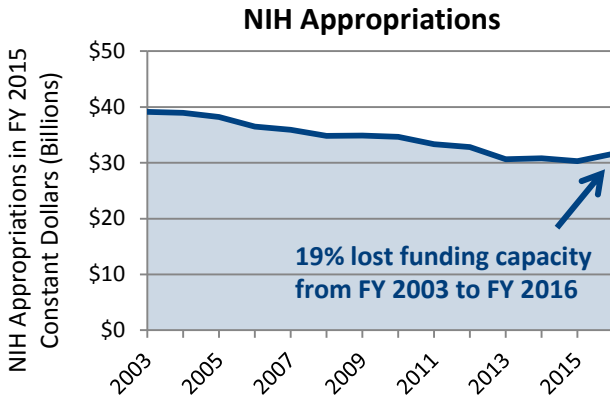

State Funding Facts for FY 2016

The **National Institutes of Health (NIH)** is the nation's primary medical research agency, supporting research efforts in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. Its **mission** is to seek fundamental knowledge about the nature and behavior of living systems and the application of that knowledge to enhance health, lengthen life, and reduce the burdens of illness and disability.

NIH Funding Improves Health in Mississippi

- In FY 2016, Mississippi Institutions held **six** active Institutional Development Award (IDeA) grants.
- 14** NIH-supported clinical trials were initiated at Mississippi institutions in FY 2016.²

INVESTMENT IN NIH RESEARCH BENEFITS THE MISSISSIPPI ECONOMY

- Mississippi institutions received more than \$600,000 in NIH grants in FY 2016 to train the next generation of innovative scientists.¹
- In 2014, Mississippi was home to 458 bioscience business establishments. Residents held 6,425 bioscience industry jobs, and the average annual wage in the bioscience sector was \$24,416 higher than the private sector overall.³
