- \$1.36M** NIH funding for workforce training and development grants in Nebraska, which help prepare the scientific leaders of the future
- \$1.76M** NIH funding to four Nebraska businesses for research and development of technology offering potential commercial applications
- 15.9K** Bioscience research industry jobs in Nebraska, which offer an average annual wage \$21.1K higher than the total private sector (2016 TEconomy Report)
- 1,032** Bioscience research industry business establishments in Nebraska operating in 2014 (2016 TEconomy Report)
