

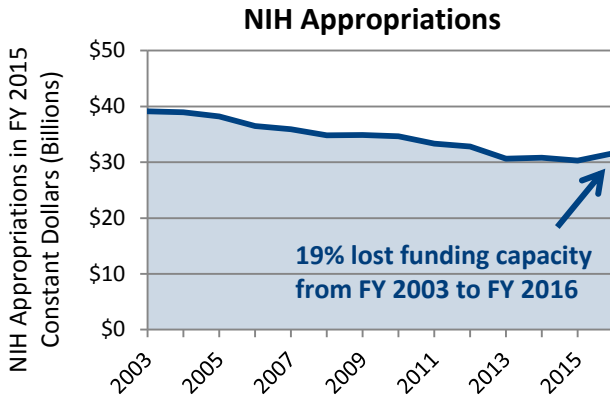

The **National Institutes of Health (NIH)** is the nation's primary medical research agency, supporting research efforts in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. Its **mission** is to seek fundamental knowledge about the nature and behavior of living systems and the application of that knowledge to enhance health, lengthen life, and reduce the burdens of illness and disability.

NIH Funding Improves Health in Ohio

Two NCI-designated cancer centers are located in Ohio.

114 NIH-supported clinical trials were initiated at Ohio institutions in FY 2016.²

INVESTMENT IN NIH RESEARCH BENEFITS THE OHIO ECONOMY

- Ohio institutions received \$20 million in NIH grants in FY 2016 to train the next generation of innovative scientists.¹
- A total of 31 Ohio businesses received NIH funding totaling \$15 million for the research and development of technologies with potential commercial applications.¹
- In 2014, Ohio was home to 2,696 bioscience business establishments. Residents held 48,102 bioscience industry jobs, and the average annual wage in the bioscience sector was \$30,631 higher than the private sector overall.³
