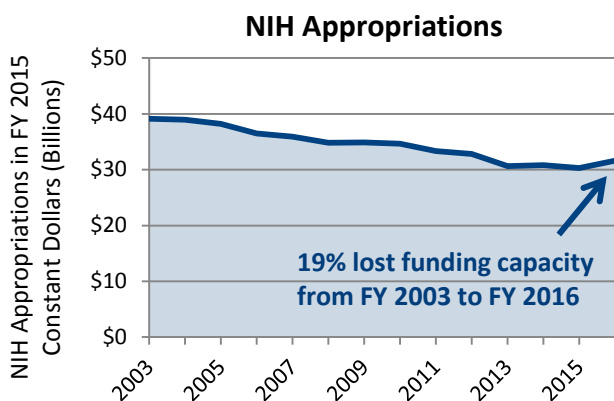

Wyoming

The **National Institutes of Health (NIH)** is the nation's primary medical research agency, supporting research efforts in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. Its **mission** is to seek fundamental knowledge about the nature and behavior of living systems and the application of that knowledge to enhance health, lengthen life, and reduce the burdens of illness and disability.

### NIH Funding Improves Health in Wyoming

- In FY 2016, Wyoming institutions held **one** active Institutional Development Award (IDeA) grants.
- 15** NIH-supported clinical trials were initiated at Wyoming institutions in FY 2016.<sup>2</sup>

### INVESTMENT IN NIH RESEARCH BENEFITS THE WYOMING ECONOMY

- Two Wyoming businesses received NIH funding totaling \$1.1 million for the research and development of technologies with potential commercial applications.<sup>1</sup>
- In 2014, Wyoming was home to 130 bioscience business establishments. Residents held 945 bioscience industry jobs, and the average annual wage in the bioscience sector was \$49,319 higher than the private sector overall.<sup>3</sup>
