

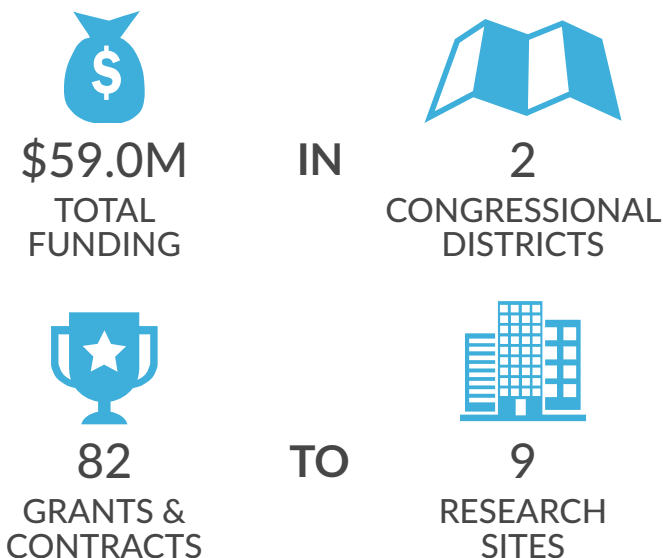
## 2019 Federal Research Funding

### BIOMEDICAL RESEARCH IN HAWAII

- \$731K** NIH funding for workforce training and development grants in Hawaii, which help prepare the scientific leaders of the future
- \$5.26M** NIH funding to four Hawaii businesses for research and development of technology offering potential commercial applications
- 3.16K** Bioscience industry jobs in Hawaii, which offer an average annual wage \$13.3K higher than the total private sector (2018 TEconomy/BIO Report)
- 208** Bioscience industry business establishments in Hawaii operating in 2016 (2018 TEconomy/BIO Report)
