

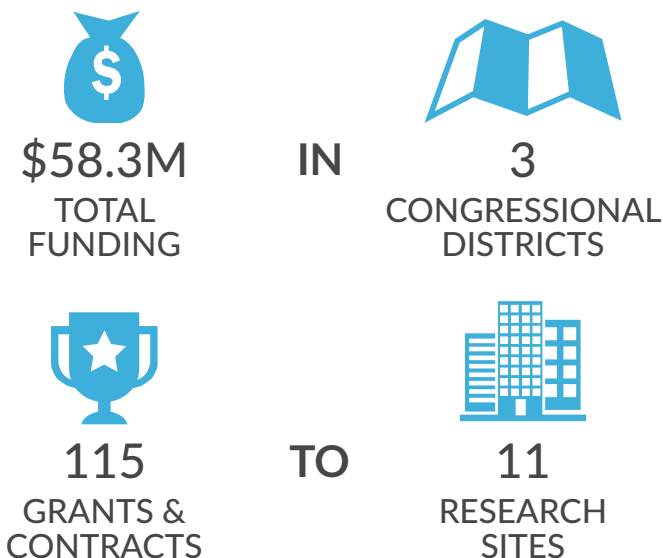

6 IDeA GRANTS to build research capacity

BIOMEDICAL RESEARCH IN ARKANSAS



- \$844K** NIH funding for workforce training and development grants in Arkansas, which help prepare the scientific leaders of the future
- \$4.81M** NIH funding to seven Arkansas businesses for research and development of technology offering potential commercial applications
- 6.97K** Bioscience industry jobs in Arkansas, which offer an average annual wage \$13.7K higher than the total private sector (2018 TEconomy/BIO Report)
- 639** Bioscience industry business establishments in Arkansas operating in 2016 (2018 TEconomy/BIO Report)
