

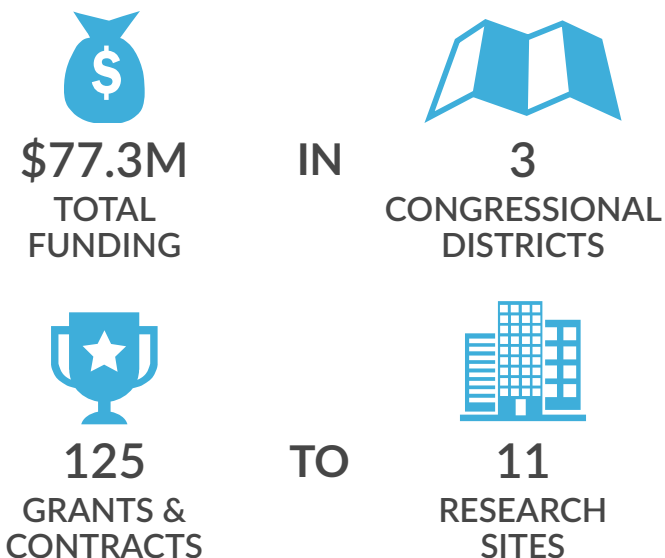


## 2020 Federal Research Funding
